Great Skiing in record snow conditions not seen in many years – 6 March, 2018

- ♦ Enjoy the best snow conditions in years and good tracksetting & grooming at this City-Centre XC ski area.
- ♦ Record end-of-season snow and trail conditions for early March.
- ♦ Get out and enjoy it before it melts....If it melts!
- ♦ Trails groomed and trackset for both Classic and Ski-skating technique on Tuesday 6 March.
- ♦ Explore and enjoy the good trails and varied flat and hilly terrain on our big area of a 27-hole golf course.
- ♦ Ride the C-train to Shaganappi and enjoy the only European-style XC ski area in North America with a Street Car / LRT service to within 200 metres to the entrance and trail head!
- ♦ Please note NO DOGS ALLOWED Shaganappi is an Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary for the resident deer, coyotes, rare birds and other wildlife.
- ♦ WE HAVE A MAJOR PROBLEM vandals cutting many ropes around sensitive and dangerous areas and breaking down the perimeter fences. CSC Volunteers have not yet had time to repair our cut ropes.
- ♦ PLEASE DO NOT CROSS ANY ROPES These are sensitive areas and costly to repair. Thanks.
- ♦ Please check the brochures and maps at the parking lot and the big maps at all 10 trail intersections.

6/ Skiers & snowshoers are asked to respect sensitive areas of the golf course:

- ♦ Please do not ski on golf greens, tee boxes or bunkers at any time. Even when rope fences are cut. Thanks.
- Please do not walk or snowshoe in set ski tracks. Thanks.
- Ski-skaters are asked to avoid damaging set tracks, Thanks.
- ♦ Wildlife (coyotes, deer & rare birds) live on the golf course, an Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary.
- No dogs allowed on Golf Course at any time, summer or winter (Calgary By-law 23M89).

7/ Grooming & Tracksetting is undertaken by volunteers with the approval of the City of Calgary:

- ♦ Calgary Ski Club and its volunteers have contributed a benefit of approx. \$250,000 incl. capital and operating costs as well as volunteer training courses since 1993. This is at no cost to Calgary taxpayers or to XC skiers and snowshoers thanks to CSC volunteer fundraising by grants and casinos.
- ◆ Trained volunteers undertake tracksetting with certification from Cross Country Canada using equipment bought by the Calgary Ski Club.
- ♦ Safety & Risk Management follows Cross Country Ski Areas Assoc. prescribed procedures.
- We will try to have the best skiing conditions ready for weekends & holidays.
- Our first priority is to pack & preserve snow using a snowmobile & grooming equipment.
- To increase skier enjoyment, we will set track if there is sufficient snow depth (15 cm, 6 inches).
- ♦ Tracksetting is best during temperature range of -4 to -8°C and a falling temperature to harden.
- ♦ Our operating minimum temperature for both volunteers & equipment is 18°C.
